Mr. LeVan is an accomplished trial and appellate lawyer who recently founded LeVan Law Group LLC. A former federal law clerk, he has a well-established record of success in a wide variety of legal practices. Mr. LeVan regularly teaches deposition workshops at The University of Pennsylvania Law School and has been a frequent guest lecturer at the Temple University Beasley School of Law. In addition to faculty engagements, he has published articles in *The Legal Intelligencer* and been quoted in numerous publications, including *The ABA Journal, Pennsylvania Law Weekly, BNA Pension & Benefits Daily* and *Law 360*.
