

## Annual Luncheon

LUNCHEON SPEAKER Tani Cantil-Sakauye Chief Justice of the CA Supreme Court

hief Justice Tani Cantil-Sakauye served 14 years as a judge on the Sacramento court. In 1990, Governor George Deukmejian appointed her to the Municipal Court, in 1997 Governor Pete Wilson elevated her to the Superior Court, in 2005 Governor Arnold Schwarzenegger nominated her to the Court of Appeal, Third Appellate District where she was unanimously confirmed by the Commission on Judicial Appointments. In 2010, Governor Arnold Schwarzenegger nominated her to Chief Justice of the California Supreme Court. The California State Bar Judicial Nomination Evaluation Commission rated her as exceptionally

well qualified for the position, and she was again unanimously confirmed by the Commission on Judicial Appointments. On November 2, 2010, voters elected Justice Cantil-Sakauye as the Chief Justice of the State of California.

On the Sacramento court, Justice Cantil-Sakauye presided over both criminal and civil assignments. In 1997, she started and presided over the first court in Sacramento dedicated solely to domestic violence issues. Her responsibilities on the Sacramento court included: Chair of the court's criminal law committee, a member of the presiding judge's task force on domestic violence, and a member of the Home Court Committee.

Currently, Justice Cantil-Sakauye is a member of the Judicial Council. On the Council, she is vice chair of the Executive and Planning Committee, former vice chair of the Rules and Projects Committee, chair of the Advisory Committee on Financial Accountability and Efficiency for the Judicial Branch, co-chair of the Judicial Recruitment and Retention Working Group, and a member of the California Commission on Impartial Courts. She has previously served as a member of the Judicial Council's Task Force on Domestic Violence Practice and Procedure and chaired the Best Practices Domestic Violence subcommittee. She serves as President of the Anthony M. Kennedy American Inn of Court, an organization dedicated to promoting civility, ethics, and professionalism in the practice of law. Since 2007, she has served as a Special Master, selected by the Supreme Court to hear disciplinary proceedings before the Commission on Judicial Performance.

Born in 1959 in Sacramento, Justice Cantil-Sakauye attended C. K. McClatchy High School (1977), and Sacramento City College (1978), before she received her B.A. from the University of California, at Davis, graduating with honors in 1980. After taking a year off to visit her ancestral homeland, the Philippines, Justice Cantil-Sakauye entered the University of California at Davis, Martin Luther King Jr. School of Law in 1981. After receiving her J.D. in 1984, she worked as a deputy district attorney for the Sacramento District Attorney's Office where she prosecuted a variety of criminal offenses. In 1988, she worked for Governor George Deukmejian, on his senior staff, in two consecutive capacities – as deputy legal affairs secretary and as a deputy legislative secretary.

## **Featured Speakers**



**Timothy R. Miller, MD** UCLA, Division of Plastic and Reconstructive Surgery Los Angeles, California

You'll often hear Tim Miller quote a 16th-century inscription he once read on the doorway of an Italian chapel: "It is the divine right of man to appear human." It's the raison d'être for Miller, who – while currently UCLA's chief of the Division of Plastic and Reconstructive Surgery, a

fully tenured professor at the medical school and one of the most in-demand plastic surgeons in a town, where there is a lot of demand – is at his core as an Army doctor.

For the past two years, Miller has been chief reconstructive surgeon for Operation Mend, a collaboration between Brooke Army Medical Center and the Ronald Reagan UCLA Medical Center to treat soldiers wounded and disfigured by bomb blasts and other attacks during service in Iraq and Afghanistan.

The program, funded by the Katz Family Foundation, pays all the costs for reconstructive surgeries at UCLA that aren't covered by the soldiers' medical plans, as well for travel to and from Los Angeles and lodging for them and their families while they receive treatment. Since Operation Mend began in the fall of 2007, it has helped 29 service men and women – and counting.



#### Joseph W. Cotchett, Esq. Cotchett, Pitre & McCarthy San Francisco, California

The National Law Journal has called Joe Cotchett one of the 100 Most Influential Lawyers in America. He is the senior partner at Cotchett, Pitre & McCarthy and has been in the top 100 attorneys selection by the Los Angeles Daily Journal for the past 13 years.

In the 1970s, Mr. Cotchett brought environmental lawsuits to save the California coast along with consumer actions which are our present consumer laws in California. In the 1980s, he won multi-million dollar verdicts for investors in white-collar fraud cases. In the 1990s, Mr. Cotchett was the trial lawyer in the Lincoln Savings & Loan case - involving Charles Keating. He won one of the largest jury verdicts then recorded on behalf of 23,000 elderly citizens – \$3.3 billion. In between, he has served as defense counsel in cases for Gallo Wines, Consumers Union of United States and various entities the firm represents. Over the years, he has done extensive civil rights and pro bono cases, including representing the CIA agent Valerie Plame against the Bush Administration.

He has authored numerous books on law, ethics, and the environment. He serves on numerous boards and several State Commissions and was a former Colonel in the Army Reserves in both JAG and Airborne Special Forces.
