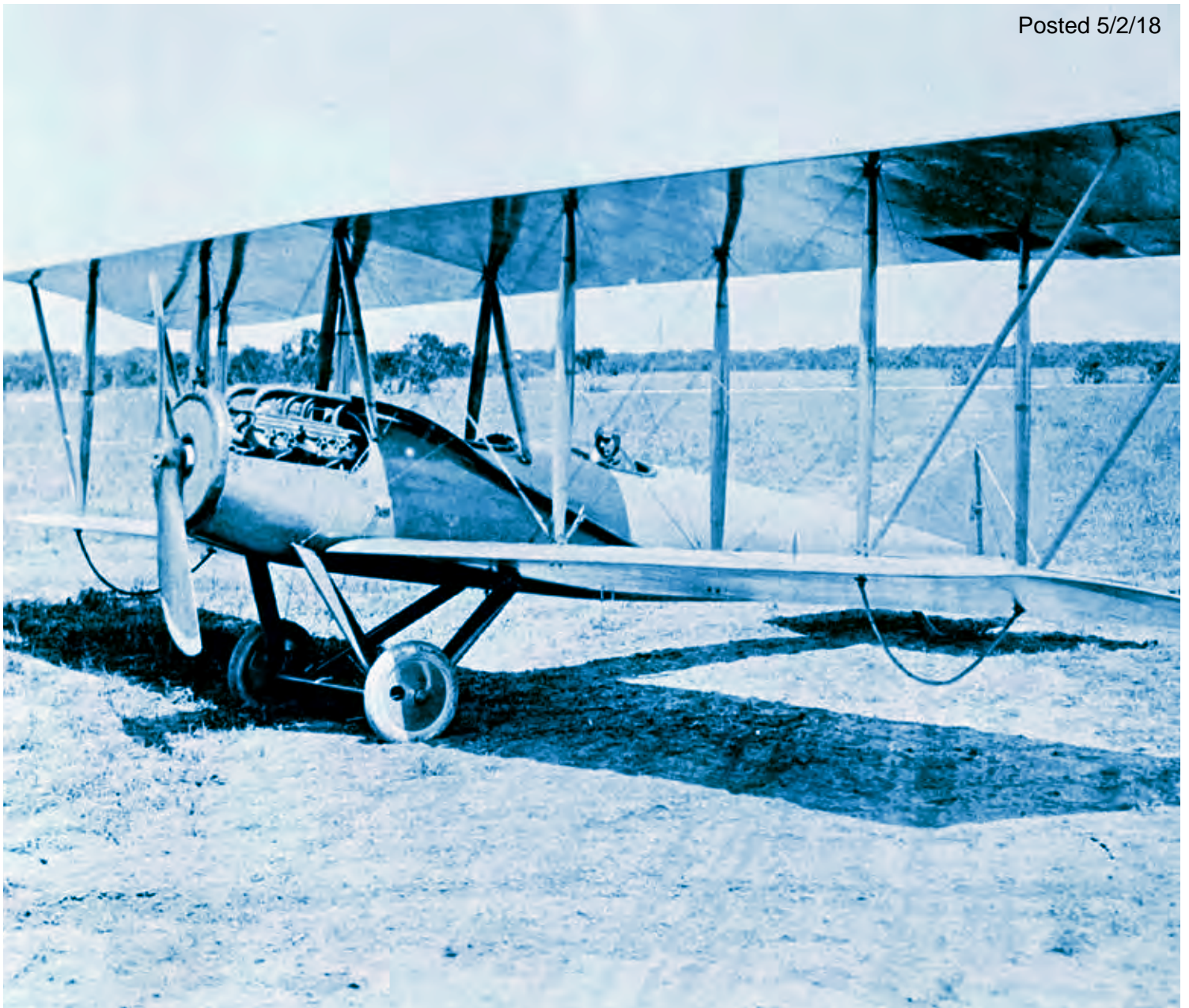

Lavin, The Illinois Appellate Court, First District Speakers: Megan Benett, Kreindler & Kreindler LLP; Andrew Harakas, Clyde & Co.</p> <p>In September 2016, Congress enacted the Justice Against Sponsors of Terrorism Act (JASTA), for the first time stripping nation-states of immunity for their role in attacks on United States soil. JASTA also expanded liability of non-state actors for their roles in acts of extraterritorial terrorism, directly impacting claims against parties that finance terrorism operations. This panel will present a mock oral argument on the subject matter jurisdictional questions that will likely—or, in the case of the landmark litigation against the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia for its alleged role in the 9/11 attacks, have already arisen—in terrorism litigation going forward. Plaintiff and defense counsel experienced in a variety of terrorism litigation and foreign sovereign immunity issues will present arguments based on a mock fact pattern to a judicial participant, who will question the attorneys on the scope of civil and criminal liability, the relationship among JASTA, the Anti-Terrorism Act and the Foreign Sovereign Immunity Act and threshold discovery concerns, eliciting some of the key challenges facing both sides in terrorism litigation. The argument will be followed by a brief Q&A with the audience, time permitting.</p>
